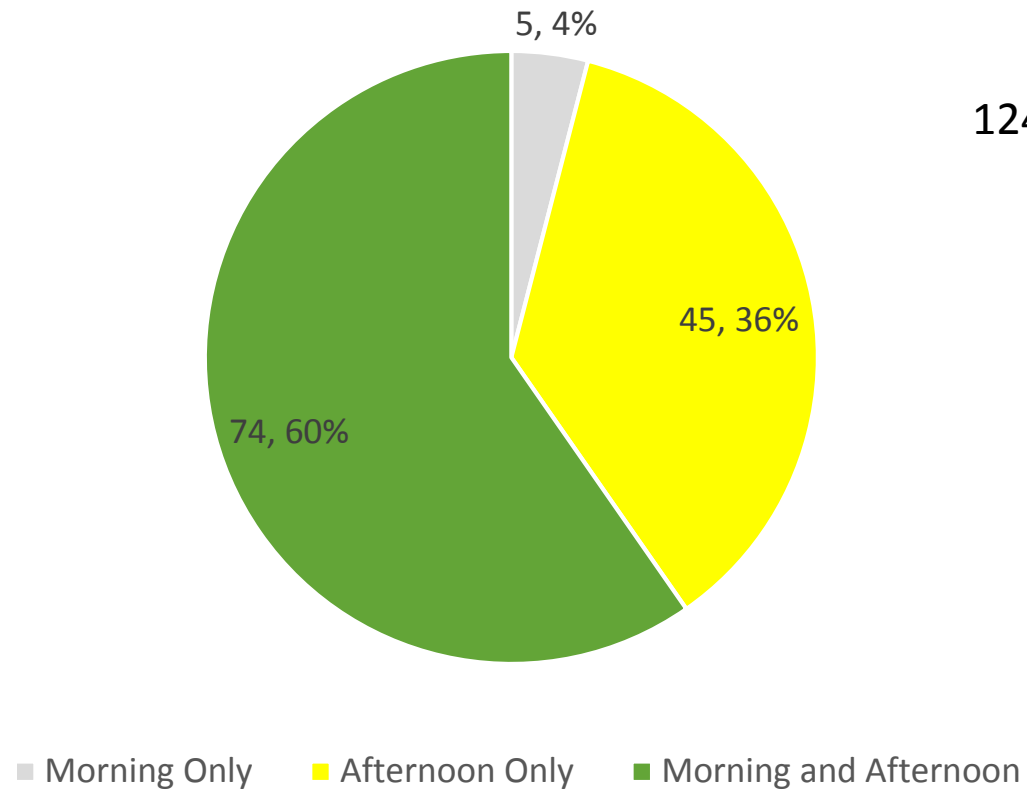

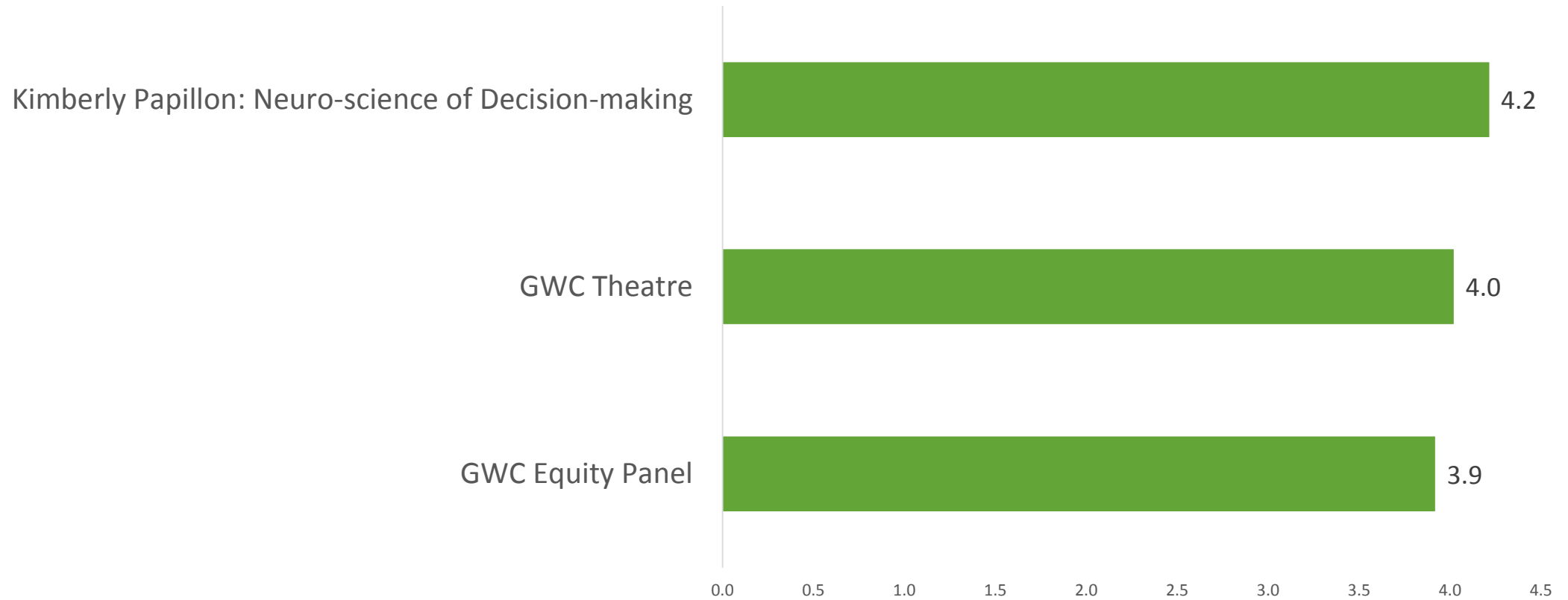
Which session(s) did you attend?

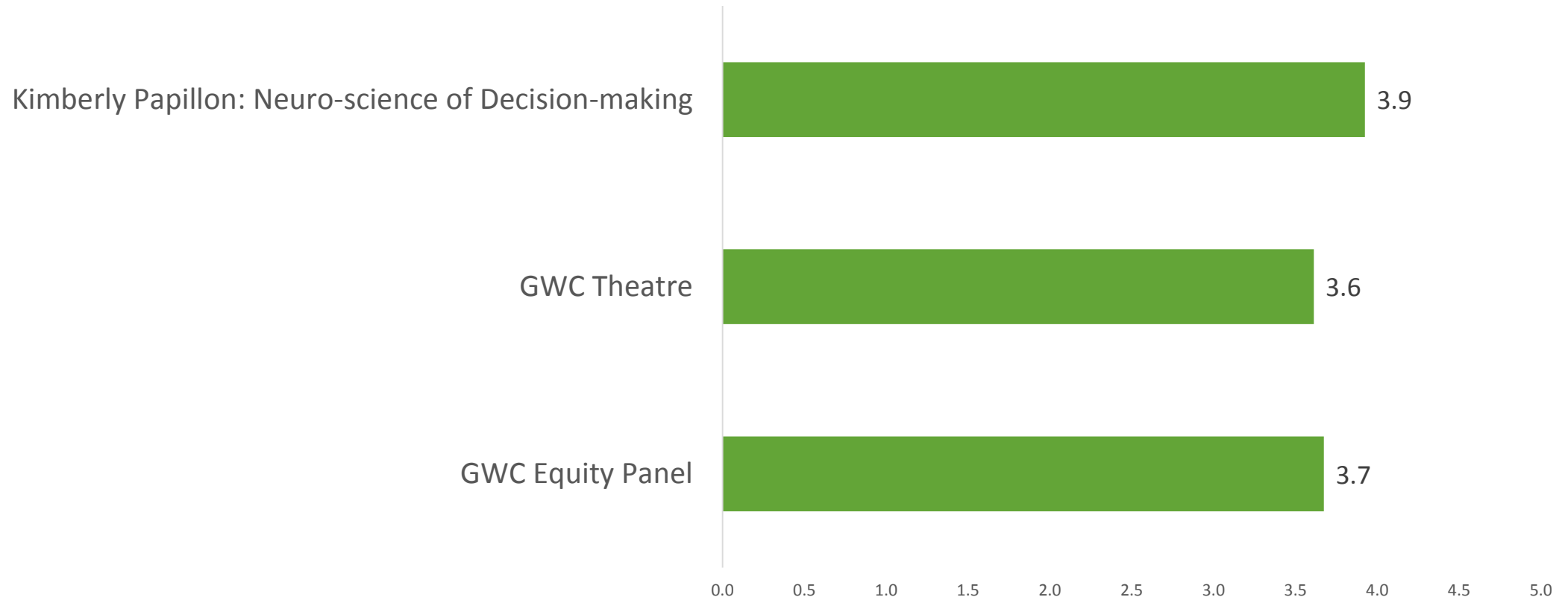
Overall Impression of Presentations

5 = Excellent; 1 = Very Poor

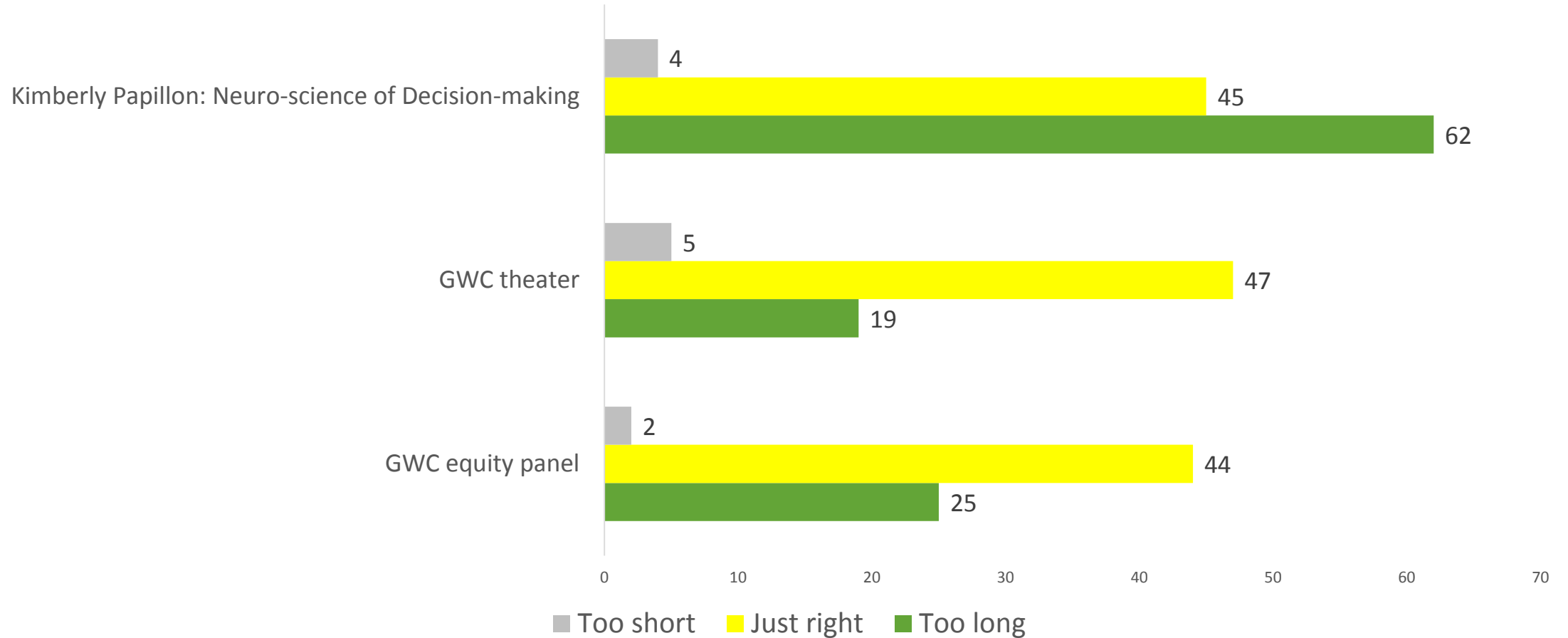


Usefulness of Presentations

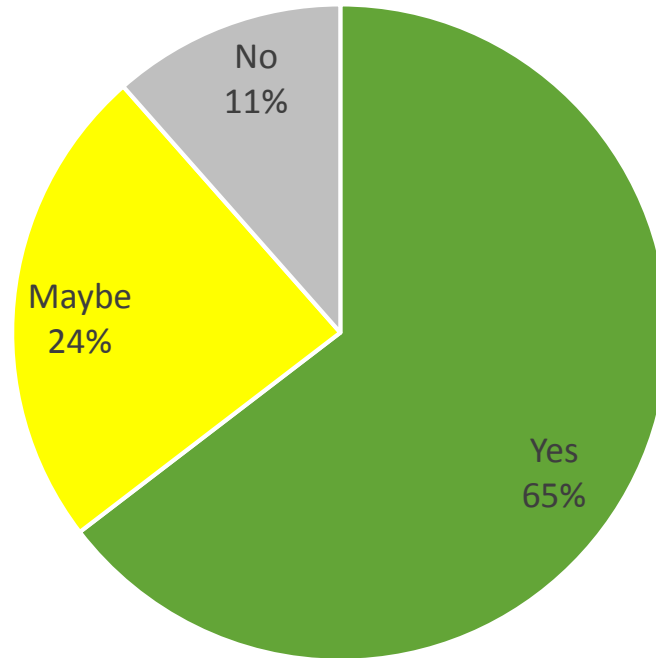
5 = Very useful; 1 = Not useful at all



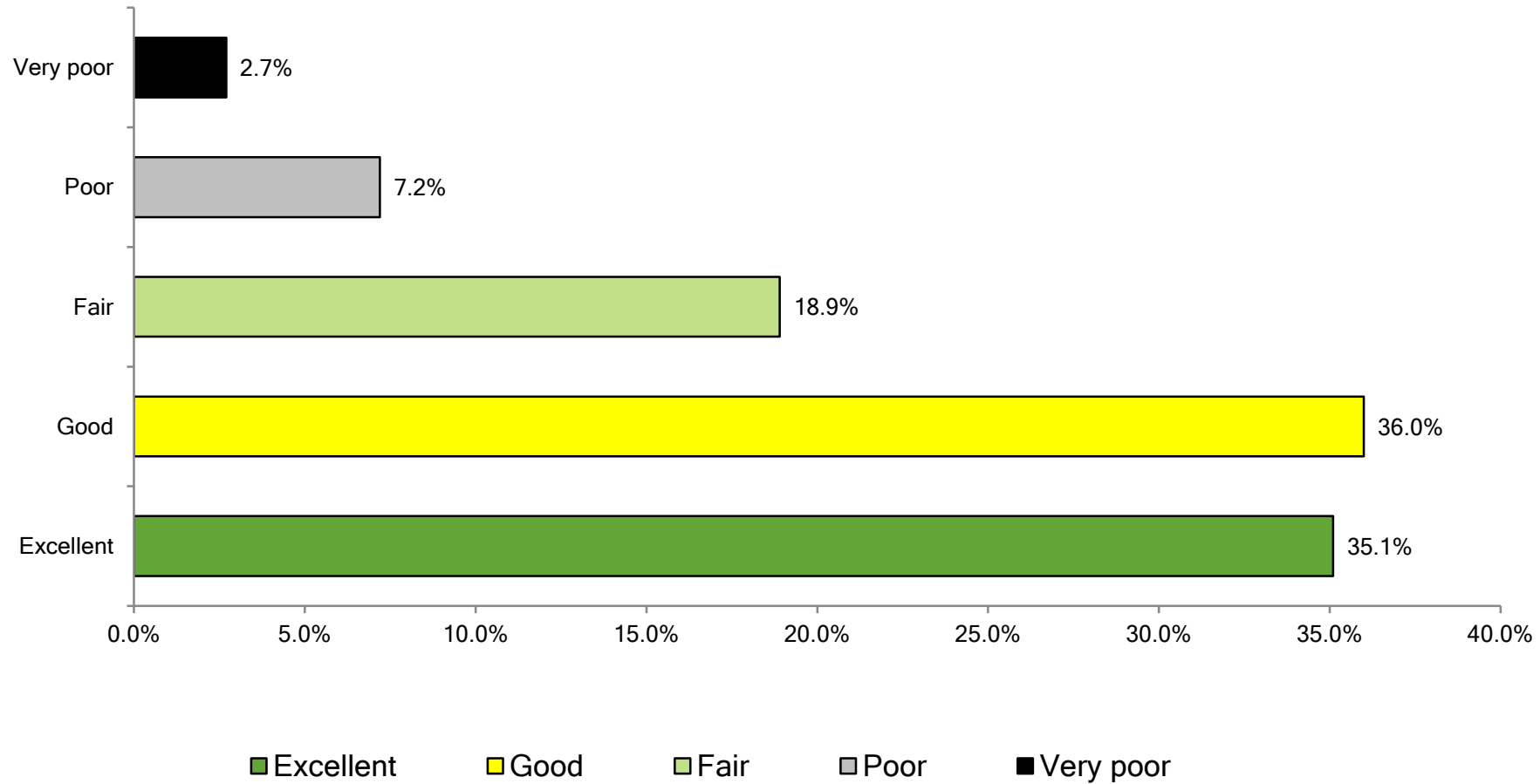
Duration of presentations



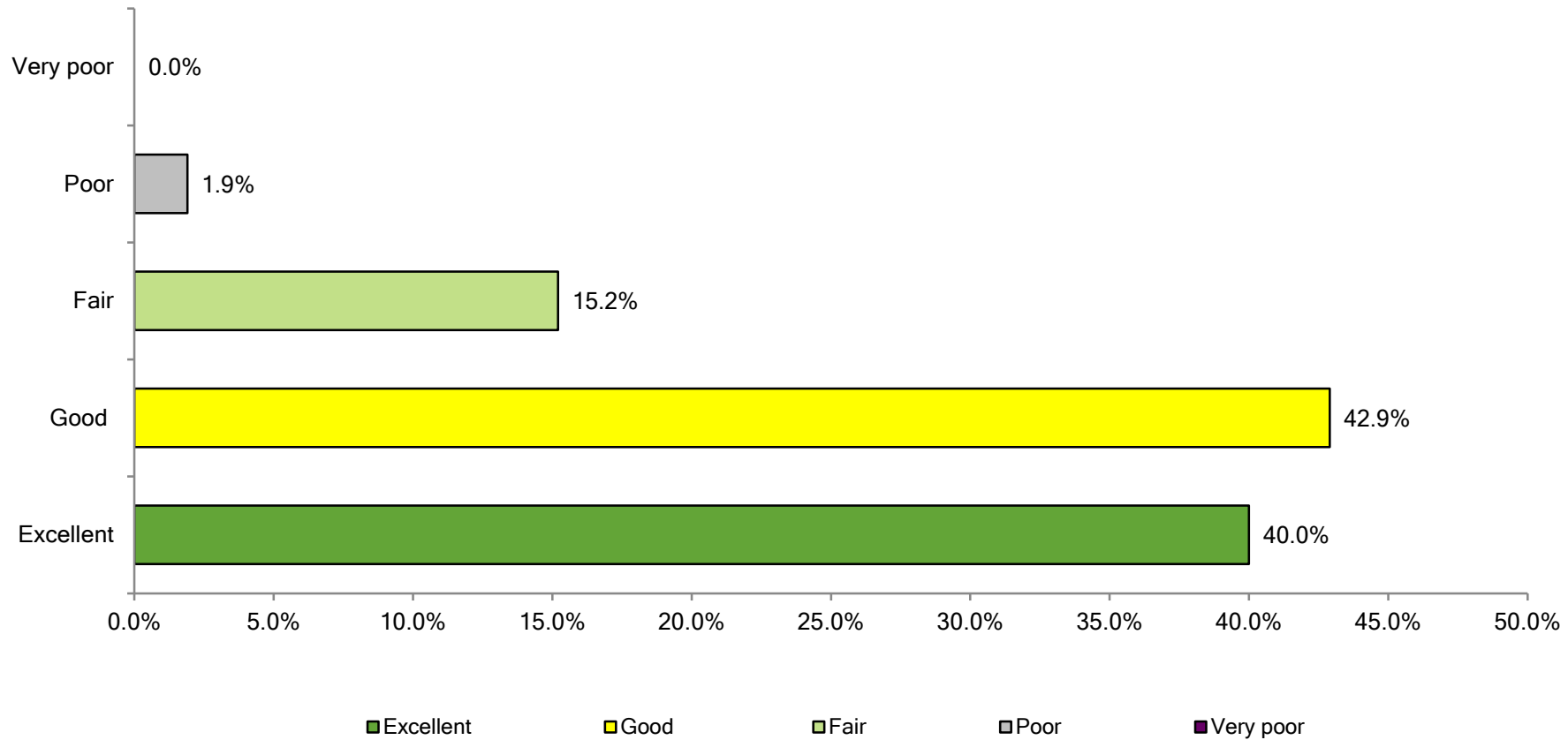
Will you apply what you learned?
